SUBJECT: MCIR Modernization Year in Review: Progress Toward Transition to STC|ONE

As we reflect on the past year, we want to share an update on the progress made toward the transition to **STC|ONE**, Michigan's modernized Immunization Information System. MCIR Modernization is designed to improve system reliability, streamline workflows, and enhance data quality for all MCIR users. Thanks to the continued partnership and collaboration of our providers, vendors, and stakeholders, 2025 has been a year of meaningful progress.

★ **Highlights from the Past Year**

Over the past year, we've reached several important milestones in preparation for go-live, including:

- **Built a test environment:** MCIR Teams can now validate data migration mapping, workflows, and system functionality.
- **Production environment established:** Healthcare organization and facility data have been imported into the system's production environment.
- **HL7 onboarding freeze implemented:** Current EMR/EHR vendors began testing with STC|ONE.
- **Learning Management System (LMS) launched:** The LMS hosts interactive e-learning courses, a media library, and Quick Reference Guides (QRGs).

- **Internal training underway:** Staff are preparing to support providers before, during, and after the transition.
- **Ongoing collaboration with the Department of Technology, Management, and Budget (DTMB):** This work helps confirm the modernized MCIR system meets security, accessibility, and compliance requirements.

These milestones reflect a strong foundation for the next phase of the MCIR Modernization project.

Looking Ahead

In the coming months, our focus will shift to the final steps needed for a successful transition, including:

- **Secure data migration:** Moving data to the modernized system while confirming accuracy and maintaining reliable access without disruption.
- **Continued work with healthcare record system providers (EHR/EMR):** Testing how information is sent and received between systems so that records update correctly and without errors.
- **End-user training:** Offering training opportunities, transition resources, support information, and ways to provide feedback.
- **Implementation and go-live planning:** Continuing preparation for the launch of the MCIR Modernization system.

We will continue to share updates and guidance as these activities progress.
